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**NEW RESEARCH REVEALS MOST (AND LEAST) EXPENSIVE
PLACES FOR STUDENT RENTED ACCOMMODATION IN
UK**

at top of average student rent list, Hull and Middlesbrough the
lowest –*

(London, 26/2/03) Accommodation for Students (www.accommodationforstudents.com), the UK's No 1 student accommodation website, has just released new research into the nationwide cost of rented student accommodation based on 7000 properties in 45 university locations across the UK featured on its website. It reveals that the current average weekly rent for a student in the UK is £53.80. London and Oxford, however, at an average weekly rent of £102 and £79 respectively, are 90% and 47% higher than average. Best value locations in terms of student rental accommodation are Middlesbrough, Crewe and Hull with average weekly rents of £34, £35 and £37 respectively.

There is also a strong North/South bias. Traditional northern redbrick university towns like Manchester, Liverpool, Sheffield, Birmingham and Leicester all have below average rents, whilst Reading, Brighton, Southampton, Bristol and Exeter are all above average. (See below for full list and index.) Interestingly, too, main Scottish university towns

are not cheap to live in. Glasgow and Edinburgh, with rents of £67 and £60 per week, are 25% and 12% above the national average.

William Berry, co-founder and director of Accommodation for Students, said:

“With the Government’s policy change in regard to tuition fees becoming a major new factor in the cost of being a full-time student, the price of accommodation will increasingly be a potential compensating cost consideration in future students’ selection of which universities they will attend. We may well see students choosing universities based on the cost of accommodation rather than curricular availability or academic reputation.”

Accommodation for Students has 20,000 properties on its website, including larger student private housing schemes, such as those provided by UNITE and Jarvis UPP, as well as private rented sector properties. The site, at its peak, attracts over 80,000 unique student visitors a month.

Accommodation for Students' website offers sophisticated facilities for both students and landlords. Students, via a user-friendly GUI and powerful search engine, can specify property requirements from the widest accommodation criteria available, right down to the provision of satellite TV. Private landlords have their own admin suite that allows them to upload and edit properties directly. Uniquely, they can

measure their performance in terms of student hits, enquiries, viewings etc – and the service is free.
